We originally hoped to put tables in the parking lot at church and have a buffet table with the meal. However, the UUA advises not to serve food in a communal way. With help and creativity from our Board, we have devised a plan. If you and your household would like to enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving meal, Bill & I will cook the turkeys and stuffing and a team of other people will be cooking food at their homes and they will deliver it to us. Bill & I will assemble a meal for each person in your home. Then our team will form a caravan Thanksgiving afternoon to take the meals to everyone who has signed up. While we won't

be together with our UUCOD family, you will be able to enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving meal.

The Migrant Education Program Christmas Party & Toy Drive Is Back!!!!

We are thrilled to announce that UUCOD will be participating in CVUSD's Migrant Education Program's Christmas Party & Toy Drive. This much-loved program helps our migrant families who live in the East Valley have a more joyful Christmas. In past years, volunteers served a buffet dinner to all the families who attended the party held in early December. Leading up to it, we held a Toy Drive and you, our beloved Congregation, would bring in hundreds of unwrapped toys which the children and youth could pick from at the party. Due to Coronavirus and the need to practice social distancing, this year's plans have changed. Instead of holding a traditional party, families will have a Caravan Christmas Party. Plated dinners and special surprises will be given to each family member in their car upon their arrival at the Migrant Education Center.

For the Toy Drive, instead of purchasing toys and bringing them to UUCOD, we will be collecting donations electronically via a **TOY DRIVE DONATIONS** button, much like the weekly Virtual Offering Basket for Sunday Services. The total funds collected will be converted into a Scrip e-gift card and emailed to the Migrant Education Program. They will then shop for toys, which will be handed out to each child and youth when they drive up. Additionally, the funds in the Migrant Education Reserve account will be added to this to help make as many children as possible have a Christmas toy. Currently, there are 1,650 migrant children & youth in Kindergarten through grade 12 within CVUSD. For a majority of them, if it wasn't for our generosity, they would simply not receive anything at Christmas.

TOY DRIVE DONATION

This year we have added another fun way for you to support migrant families. We are holding our **First Annual Thanks & Giving Food Donation Calendar** which will donate greatly needed non-perishable foods to these families. The calendar is below this article. On it is a list of items that are to be placed in a box each day in November. You are to fill the box with all the items (no substitutes) making sure they are not expired. Your box filled with all the items will be dropped at UUCOD on December 4 and the Social Justice Committee will take them to the Migrant Education Center for distribution to the families at their Christmas Party. You must sign up to participate so we can let the Migrant Education Program know how many boxes will be collected. We hope to have another successful year for this much-loved UUCOD tradition. UUCOD Afternoon Book Group

The afternoon book group will be having a Zoom meeting the last Friday of the month, November 27th, at 1:30 p.m. Please join us to discuss *The Sympathizer*. It is the 2015 debut novel by Vietnamese American professor Viet Thanh Nguyen. It is a best-

selling novel and recipient of the 2016 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction.

The novel fits the expectations of a number of different novel genres: immigrant, mystery, political, historical fiction, dark comedic, spy, and war. The story depicts the anonymous narrator, a North Vietnamese mole in the South Vietnamese army, who stays embedded in a South Vietnamese community in exile in the United States. Nguyen weaves an intricate, layered story of a character who faces the cataclysmic dread of being found out on a daily (if not hourly) basis, yet who also desperately wants to find his own identity and place himself within a familiar and familial context. Yes, he identifies as a double agent, but he also identifies as “illegitimate, bastard, Eurasian, Amerasian, love child, natural child.”

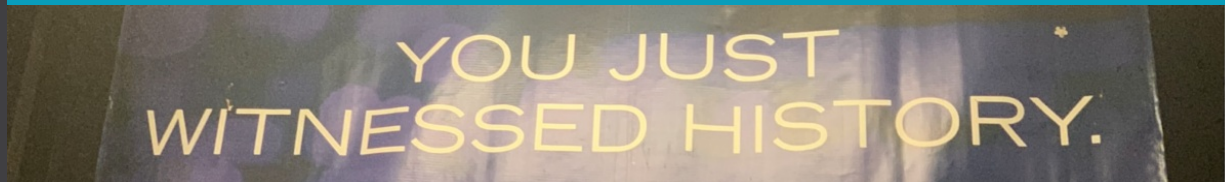
Art Talk Blurb

November's Share the Plate to Benefit Holiday Gift Drive for SafeHouse of the Desert & Harrison House

Remember last year when there was a little Christmas tree on the patio, filled with tags of names and gift requests from young people at SafeHouse and Harrison House? You bought & brought them back to UUCOD and we wrapped and gave them to the residents at Christmas time. Unfortunately due to Coronavirus restrictions, things will be a bit different this year. But one thing will remain the same: we will still be able to give these teenagers and young adults the love and support they so desperately need.

Our Sunday, November 22nd Share the Plate will benefit SafeHouse of the Desert & Harrison House. Instead of buying the requested items, your generous giving will be used to purchase Target e-gift cards from our Scrip program, which residents will use to buy

their own present. It's just like when your Aunt Edna or Grandpa gave you money at Christmas. You bought what you wanted and needed.

Safehouse of the Desert is a life-saving shelter for youth ages 11 to 17 who have run away from home or whose parents no longer want them there. Some have been victims of human trafficking and have no place to go once they are picked up by police. It is a small shelter, housing 7 girls as of mid October. Harrison House is transitional housing for young adults 18 to 21 years of age, some who have "aged out" of the foster care system and have limited ability and resources to live on their own. There are currently 16 young people living there. As the holidays draw closer, both facilities expect to see more youth and young adults walk through their doors.

Sadly, they have been severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Program Director Shawn Johnson says that Coachella Valley organizations that have regularly donated funds to the two programs have been unable to provide their typical level of financial support, which staff at Safehouse and Harrison House rely upon to keep these much-needed programs operating. They have had to cut staff, repairs have been postponed, and they are unable to purchase new furniture for the housing units, which has been worn out over years of continued use. Keeping the programs going has been paramount as they can literally be lifesavers for youth in our community. They need financial support now more than ever before.

This is the second Share the Plate that we, the Congregation voted on last May. Your donation will provide a happier holiday for these youth and young adults who have literally nowhere to go and are in need of everything. Please give as generously as you are able.
